Mobile County Commission Gives Campaign Big Boost!

At its meeting on October 22 the Mobile County Commission approved a contract in the amount of \$250,000 from its general fund to assist in funding the restoration and renovation of Barton Academy. Barton Academy for Advanced World Studies will occupy the historic building on Government Street and is expected to open in the fall of 2020.

“The Mobile County Commission is proud to support Barton Academy for Advanced World Studies. As the oldest public school in the State of Alabama, Barton Academy is a treasure for our community, and its restoration and renovation emphasize Mobile County’s commitment to education,” said Commission President Connie Hudson.

The Mobile County Board of School Commissioners and I are very committed to and excited about the opportunity to bring the Barton Academy for Advanced World



Studies to downtown Mobile. The academy will provide opportunities for our students to explore the world around them. It will also be an asset to downtown Mobile, where Barton’s Greek revival architecture has been a symbol of public education since

the building first opened in 1836. We have been working with the architect on the interior plan, which will include state-of-the-art classrooms, and previously committed approximately \$4 million to renovate the exterior of Barton. In addition, our Division of Academic Affairs has worked diligently on a plan to make the Barton Academy for Advanced World Studies a one-of-a-kind school that the entire region will be proud to have.

Barton Academy for Advanced World Studies will engage its students in comparative studies of the United States to countries around the world. Learning will be enhanced through

real-world experiences provided within Mobile’s international business community through partnerships with corporations, business leaders, colleges and universities, and community arts organizations. The school will have rigorous entrance requirements, and students will have opportunities to earn high school credits while in the eighth grade and college credit while in ninth grade. We look forward to seeing Barton Academy graduates become leaders in international business, industry and institutions of higher learning in Mobile and throughout southwest Alabama.

Honor Your Ancestors with a Gift to Barton Academy

Naming a room or space within Barton Academy for Advanced World Studies or a section of the original cast iron fencing is an excellent way to ensure that your family name remains a part of Mobile's history. For as little as \$1,000, you can have your name or the name of a family member engraved on a permanent plaque.

Naming opportunities range from \$10,000 (8' fence section/\$2,000 per year for 5 years) to \$4,000,000 (Yerby Building). Other options include classroom spaces at \$25,000 (\$5000 per year payable over 5 years) and science labs at \$250,000.

Growing up in Mobile in the 1950's and 60's, I was distressed to see many gorgeous and impressive structures demolished. Not many people seemed particularly interested. This attitude gradually changed, thank God, and we have managed to preserve a great deal of our heritage. But we still suffer painful losses and, consequently, have to actively move to save our historic resources, rather than see them boarded up and "waiting" and perhaps eventually reduced to mere piles of smoking debris.

So it was with my feelings about Barton Academy, an iconic landmark not just for Mobile, but for the entire State of Alabama. We had waited too long for someone else to "do something." I felt I had to be involved with the enterprise that actually got it done, that preserved and repurposed it back into what our antecedents had intended it to be: a magnificent tool in the progress and enhancement of the community.
